


The Downtown Business Improvement District (BID) area is home to the nation's second strongest office market, a growing residential community and an array of exciting new restaurants and world renown arts, culture and entertainment anchors including the National Portrait Gallery and Smithsonian American Art Museum, the Verizon Center, the International Spy Museum and the Theatre District.

Retail is returning to Downtown because of strong, multifaceted demand for shoppers' goods within 15 blocks of 9th and G Streets, NW:

- 475,000 office workers
- 59,000 residents (24,600 new residents from 2000 to 2012)
- Increasing household incomes (more than \$100,000 in 19,000 new households from 2000 to 2012)
- 16,000 hotel rooms
- 7.1 million Downtown visitors




f street

F Street is the next available opportunity in Downtown's retail revitalization. In the 900, 1000 and 1100 blocks of F Street, more than 75,000 square feet are available, with another 34,000 square feet coming on line in 2008 and 2009. The map on the inside page shows these opportunities. The F Street retail cluster will complement the current ones at Gallery Place (along 7th and H Streets) and on 13th between G and F Streets. 




7th & h streets

The Chinatown neighborhood has become a hotbed of activity, anchored by the Verizon Center (formerly MCI Center) and the Gallery Place retail, residential, office and entertainment complex. Several individually-owned sites of undeveloped or underdeveloped real estate are available in this densely traveled area. A newly planned, mixed-use development at the last remaining corner property, Riverdale International's Gallery Square, will offer 30,000 square feet on three floors of above-ground retail and one below-ground retail space in the next year.







Retail Space Available in 2007




Retail Space Future Availability








Old Convention Center Site Shopping*





RESIDENTIAL OVERVIEW OF WASHINGTON DC



Circulator Route Map


